Starting in 2011, FACCE considered how to work with the (many) ERA-NETs in its thematic remit: workshops in 2011, 2013
→ Joint call with BiodivERsA, interactions with ERA-NETs CIRCLE2, CoreOrganic, SusCrop, SusAn...

In 2016, publication of a 'FACCE-JPI European and International Cooperation Strategy »

Starting point: thematic overlap/ complementarity and a willingness to work together

Working with the ERA-NET BiodivERsA

2013 joint call: Promoting synergies and reducing trade-offs between food supply, biodiversity and ecosystem services

Theme 1: To what extent can biodiversity better support agro-ecosystems / agricultural production systems in terms of multi-functionality and outcomes in a global change context?

Theme 2: Which policies and governance systems can promote the emergence and support of agro-ecosystems / agricultural production systems benefiting from and beneficial to biodiversity and ecosystem services?

10 projects funded

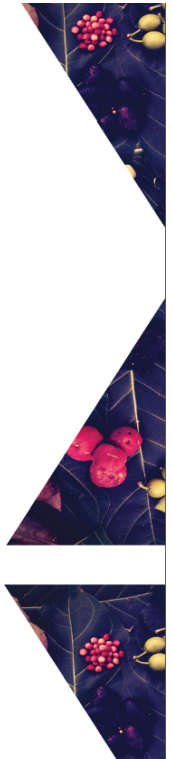
MISSION: TO WORK TOWARDS AN INTEGRATED FOOD SYSTEM APPROACH, FROM FARM TO FORK, THAT PROVIDES SUSTAINABLE, RESILIENT AND NUTRITIONAL FOOD FROM BOTH LAND AND SEA.

Food and nutrition security was defined in 2012 at the thirty-ninth session of the World Committee on Food Security as:

"All people at all times have physical, economic and social access to food, which is safe and consumed in sufficient quantity and quality to meet their dietary needs and food preferences, and is supported by an environment of adequate sanitation, health services and care, allowing for a healthy and active life".

A food system is defined as:

"an interconnected web of activities, resources and people that extends across all domains involved in providing human nourishment and sustaining health, including production,
